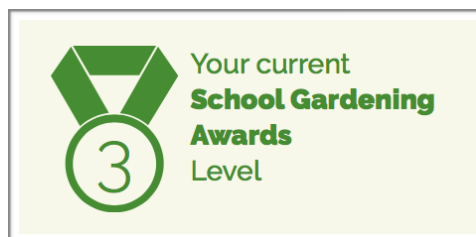
Summer 1st Half Term
